An art embracing the mind, body and spirit – Originating in ancient China, tai chi is one of the most effective exercises for health of mind and body. Although an art with great depth of knowledge and skill, it can be easy to learn and soon delivers its health benefits. Numerous studies have shown tai chi improves: muscular strength, flexibility, fitness, immunity, pain relief and overall quality of life. In addition to these components, tai chi movements emphasize weight transference to improve balance and prevent falls. Regular practice of tai chi can also improve posture. Developing correct posture will result in less wear and tear of the joint muscles.
